South Wales Junior Open / Agored Iau De Cymru

Jordan Davies , produced some amazing squash to win the Boys Under 23 event, beating favorite and no 1 seed David Haley of Newport in the final 3 – 0.

In the final Jordan started strongly and attacked from the word go.

David Healy kept with him in the game but Jordan was always one step ahead and took the first game 11/9 and the second 13/11. In the third Jordan had a 9-6 lead but after four mistakes Dave had a chance to take a game. Jordan came back to take it to another tie break which he won 13/11 and the match 3-0.

A fantastic result for Jordan who is certainly in fine form at the moment.

Belgian Junior Open

On the weekend of the 4th to 6th November Jordan was on his travels again. This time it was overseas to Herentals in Belgium for the Belgian Junior Open 2011 in the Boys Under 19 event along with High Performance coaches Nic Birt and Greg Tippings. After his impressive display at the British Junior Championshipss last weekend Jordan was in good form again. Jordan made it to the quarter-finals losing out to Daniel Hockborne. The match was a tight one going to a tie break in 2 of the games a great effort from Jordan who went on to finish 8th in the event.

Welsh Junior Closed

On the weekend of the 11th to 13th November 2011 juniors competed at the Celtic Waste Management Services Welsh Junior Closed Squash Championships 2011.

With over 100 entries over all the age groups the event began on Friday evening and with over 250 matches to complete the courts were full from the word go.

Some excellent squash was on display and in particular the boys Under 19 event. Jordan Davies looked strong and composed in every match he played and, in what was the deciding match against Joel Makin, Jordan pulled out all the stops to make the match his. In one of the best matches of the event, and one of the toughest to referee, Jordan kept his cool and maintained his level of squash to come out 3–1 winner and retain his Welsh title.

North East Wales – Adult Tournament

In a very competitive Men's A event Jordan Davies gave some tremendous performances and showed his quality. Jordan pushing number two seed Nic Birt and narrowly losing 15-13 in the fourth game. A great effort.

Swiss Junior Open

On the weekend of the 2nd to 4th of December Jordan travelled to Zurich in Switzerland for the Cool and Clean Swiss Junior Open 2011. One of the biggest European Junior event of the year. In the Boys Under 19 event Jordan had a great tournament and in the quarter-finals beat the 3rd seed Saad Sahid of Pakistan to reach the semi-final.

He lost to the number 2 seed and eventual winner Tom DeMulder of Belgium in another tight semi final match but came out on top in his last match to take a well deserved 3rd place.

Under 18/20 Test Matches

On the weekend of the 10th and 11th December Wales welcomed teams from England and Scotland for the Under 18 and Under 20 Test matches. The three countries played each other twice in each age group so that players were rotated in teams so that they do not play the same opponent twice. The teams included top players as well as some younger players.

Jordan had a very successful weekend winning all four of his matches as the No 1 player.

North Wales Junior Closed

On the weekend of the 3rd and 5th February all the Welsh Juniors travelled to Saints Health and Fitness to play in the North Wales Junior Closed. Jordan competed in the U'19 age group and won all his games comfortably to take the title.

Jordan Davies – Wales Captain

Jordan will fly to Portugal on March 29th for 11 days as Wales Captain, and in May will fly to Germany again to represent Wales.

Jordan has had a magnificent year, and is a world class sportsman. We wish him all the best in his examination and for the future, hopefully as a professional Squash player.
